Gentlemen:

This refers to the inspection conducted by Messrs. R. C. Stewart and W. G. Hubacek of this office on February 27-28, 1975, of activities authorized by NRC Construction Permit Nos. CPPR-126 and 127 for the Comanche Peak facility, Units 1 and 2, and to the discussion of the findings held by the inspectors with Mr. H. C. Schmidt of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

Areas examined during the inspection and our findings are discussed in the enclosed inspection report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examination of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector.

During the inspection it was found that certain activities under your license appear to be in noncompliance with Appendix B to 10 CFR 50 of the NRC Regulations, "Quality Assurance Criteria for Nuclear Power Plants". The item of noncompliance and references to the pertinent requirements are identified in Section 1 of the summary of the enclosed report.

We have also examined actions you have taken with regard to the previously identified unresolved item. The status of this item is identified in Section IV of the summary of the enclosed report.
