NOTICE OF VIOLATION

In review of a diagnostic misadministration report dated April 7, 1989, a violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C (1988), the violation is listed below:

10 CFR 35.33(c) requires, in part, that when a misadministration involves a diagnostic procedure, the Radiation Safety Officer shall notify the referring physician and the appropriate NRC office in writing within 15 days if the misadministration involved the administration of byproduct material such that the patient is likely to receive an organ dose greater than 2 rem, the administration of a material not intended for medical use, or a dosage five-fold different from the intended dose.

Contrary to the above, the licensee failed to report to NRC until April 7, 1989, such a diagnostic misadministration that occurred on March 14, 1989.

This is a Severity Level V violation. (Supplement VI)

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Oklahoma Osteopathic Hospital is hereby required to submit to this office, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice, a written statement or explanation in reply, including for each violation: (1) the reason for the violation if admitted, (2) the corrective steps which have been taken and the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time.
