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NRC STAFF DENIES APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF LICENSE TO OPERATE UTAH URANIUM MILL

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff has denied an application from Atlas Corporation of Grand Junction, Colorado, for renewal of its license authorizing operation of an uranium ore milling facility at Moab, Utah.

The staff also has issued to the company an immediately effective grder which secprohibits ore processing and which requires continued care and monitoring of the Moab site as well as other necessary actions to protect workers and the environment. In addition, the Order directs Atlas Corporation to begin decontamination and decommissioning of the mill facility and reclamation of the uranium mill tailings stored there.

The action was taken after Atlas Corporation was unable to provide Sinancial surely arrangements acceptable to the staff, for assuring that funds would be available to pay for decontamination and decommissioning of the Moab mill. Establishmen required by NRC regulations which became effective in November 1980.

Jos an acceptable Sinancial surety arrangement prior to issuance of a new license for license renewal is The requirement was incorporated into the license authorizing Atlas to operate the Moab mill in June 1982 and specified that the company was to have a NRC-approved financial surety arrangement by June 1983. The regulations also require the demonstration of a financial surety arrangement prior to issuance of a new license or license renewal which led to the staff's denial of the Atlas renewal application.
