NOTICE OF VIOLATION

During the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) inspection conducted on June 22, 1989, a violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C, 53 Federal Register 40019 (October 13, 1988), the violation is listed below:

License Condition 19A requires the licensee to conduct its program in accordance with the application dated July 13, 1987.

Item 12 of the application dated July 13, 1987, requires the licensee to conduct annual refresher training for housekeeping and security personnel.


Contrary to the above, the licensee did not conduct annual refresher training for housekeeping and security personnel between June 16, 1987 and June 22, 1989.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Charleston Area Medical Center is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, DC 20555, with a copy to the Regional Administrator, Region II, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this notice. This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include [for each violation]: (1) admission or denial of the violation, (2) the reason for the violation if admitted, (3) the corrective steps which have been taken and the results achieved, (4) the corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further violations, and (5) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Where good

cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order may be issued to show cause why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken.
