

SUBJECT: Gulf Mineral Resources Co. Uranium Mill License Application

Enclosed for your information is a copy of the public notice of an application for Radioactive Materials License from Gulf Mineral Resources Co. for a proposed uranium mill at San Mateo, New Mexico. The notice has been recently published in several newspapers.

If you have any questions or comments regarding the license application, please submit them in written form to this office and they will be addressed during the evaluation of the application. In the interest of a timely evaluation, the receipt of your comments and question by May 15, 1979 is requested.



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FUBLIC NOTICE

The Health and Environment Department's Environmental Improvement Division has received an application for a Radioactive Material License from Gulf Mineral Resources Co., 1720 South Bellaire St., Denver, Colorado 80222, for a proposed uranium mill to be located at San Mateo, New Mexico.

During the early part of the evaluation period, the Division will invite several state and federal agencies as well as other interested parties to review and comment upon the application. Various sections within the EID will review and comment upon the application. The EID may, at its discretion, retain consultants to assist it in its evaluation of the application. Relevant comments and questions received by the EID from various agencies and interested parties will be forwarded to the applicant for its response. Correspondence associated with the application will be on file with the Radiation Protection Section and will be available for inspection by the applicant and any other interested parties.

The Division has required the company to provide complete plans and other materials concerning, among other things, the public health, safety and environmental aspects of the proposed activity.

The license application will be analyzed carefully by the Division. During this analysis, the application will be reviewed to ensure that there are no deficiencies, that the application meets all applicable requirements and that there is no reason to believe that the mill operation will violate any laws or regulations. If the Division is so satisfied, it will issue a Radioactive Materials License, to expire in five years from the date of issuance.

The activities of all licensees are inspected periodically to assure compliance with regulations and license conditions.

SANTA FE --- The Health and Environment Department's Environmental Improvement Division has received an application for a Radioactive Material License from Gulf Mineral Resources Company, 1720 South Bellaire Street, Denver, Colorado, 80222, for a proposed uranium mill to be located at San Mateo, New Mexico.

The mill is to be located 30 miles north of Grants, near San Mateo, approximately 3 miles north of Gulf's Mt. Taylor Mine.

Using a conventional acid leach, thickener and solvent extraction, Gulf proposes to pipe the mill waste to their proposed tailings pond located six miles north of the mill in La Polvadera Canyon. They intend to ship the product (yellow cake U_3O_8) out of state to various locations by truck. Gulf states it's intention of commencing operation of the mill by late 1981.

Employment is anticipated to be 500 workers during the construction period, and reduced to 125 workers during the operation of the mill, which is expected to produce as much as 25,000 pounds per day of U₃0₈ when it reaches full production in 1985.
