Subject: LIGHTNING CAUSES REACTOR SHUTDOWN

At 8:20 p.m. (CDT), July 18, 1989, while operating at 75 percent power, Unit 1 automatically shut down. Six minutes later, Unit " which was operating at 84 percent power, also shut down.

The licensee believes that lightning strikes in the area caused the rod control system to lose power, dropping control rods into the reactors. The subsequent negative flux trip signals tripped both units. The licensee said that 10 Unit 1 rod control power supplies and seven Unit 2 power supplies deenergized on overvoltage protection.

The power supplies have been reset and the rod control systems are now operating normally. The licensee plans to restart both units today.

Region III (Chicago) is monitoring the licensee's course of action.

The State of Illinois will be notified.
