Notification of Employees' Potential Safety Issues

By letter of April 27, 1989, the Executive Director for Operations advised licensees to examine certain current and previous agreements to assure that such agreements do not contain clauses which restrict current and/or former employees (or their respective legal counsel) from providing information about potential safety issues to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

GPU Nuclear has completed its examination and found no such restrictive clauses. However, it did identify two employment settlement agreements with two individuals in which the language used to eliminate the potential for further monetary claims might be misconstrued to restrict the individual's ability to raise potential safety issues with the NRC. GPU Nuclear has elected to mail to both of these individuals' last known addresses a letter, in substantially the form attached, advising them to disregard that language so far as they would consider it as restricting their ability to raise potential safety issues to the NRC.
