Dear Mr. Tschiltz:

I am responding to the petition for rulemaking (PRM) that you submitted on behalf of the Nuclear Energy Institute, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) on January 15, 2015.¹ You requested <u>that</u> the NRC to-modify its regulations in Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Section 50.69, "Risk-informed categorization and treatment of structures, systems and components for nuclear power reactors," to clarify and extend their applicability to allow <u>holders of combined</u> licensees under 10 CFR Part 52, "Licenses, Certifications, and Approvals for Nuclear Power Plants," to implement the provisions of 10 CFR 50.69. The NRC docketed the PRM on February 6, 2015, under Docket Number PRM-50-110.

On March 27, 2015, the NRC published a notice of docketing in the *Federal Register* (80 FR 16308). The NRC held a public meeting on September 16, 2015,² to gain further understanding of the scope and basis for the PRM.

The NRC has reviewed your petition and supporting rationale. For the reasons provided in the enclosed *Federal Register* notice, the NRC will consider the <u>technical</u> issue raised in your PRM in the <u>ongoing</u> Incorporation of Lessons Learned <u>Ff</u>rom New Reactor Licensing Process (Parts 50 and 52 Licensing Process Alignment) rulemaking.

NRC action on the issue raised in PRM-50-110 can be monitored on the Federal rulemaking Web site, http<u>s</u>://www.regulations.gov, by searching for Docket ID NRC-2015-0028, which is the docket number for assigned to this petition (PRM-50-110), and Docket ID NRC-2009-0196, which is the docket number for the Incorporation of Lessons Learned Ffrom New Reactor Licensing Process (Parts 50 and 52 Licensing Process Alignment) rulemaking. In addition, the Federal rulemaking Web site allows you to receive alerts when changes or additions occur in a docket folder. As in all rulemakings, the NRC will solicit and consider public comments during the proposed rule phase of the rulemaking before determining the approach that will be the basis for the final rule.
