4. During this inspection, certain of your activities, as described below and/or attached, were in violation of NRC requirements and are being cited in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. This form is a NOTICE OF VIOLATION, which may be subject to posting in accordance with 10 CFR 19.11. (Violations and Corrective Actions) 10 CFR 35.610(e) requires, in part, that a licensee shall ensure that operators, authorized medical physicists, and authorized users participate in drills of emergency procedures for the remote afterloader unit, initially and at least annually. Contrary to the above, as of September 30, 2020, Norwalk Hospital did not ensure that all authorized medical physicists or authorized users participated in drills of emergency procedures for the remote afterloader unit initially and at least annually. Specifically, one authorized user and several authorized medical physicists who were listed on the license and infrequently used the device did not participate annually in Norwalk Hospital's emergency procedure drills. This is a Severity Level IV violation (Enforcement Policy Section 6.3) Corrective actions included removing an authorized user and authorized medical physicists not currently involved with the high dose rate remote afterloader program and planning training as of November 12, 2020, for all remaining authorized medical physicists.
