
Dear Robin Elliot,

 - a. Mr. Roch is currently listed as RSO on Manchester Memorial Hospital (USNRC Lic#06-03413-01), Rockville General Hospital (USNRC Lic# 06-13001-02), and Day Kimball Hospital (USNRC Lic#06-10957-01).
 - b. Mr. Roch is contractually committed to a minimum of a day and a half of onsite service per month dedicated to his RSO duties. This is in addition to onsite visits for equipment testing and compliance training.
 - c. In the event of Mr. Roch's absence, Ms. Cheryl Hamel (Administrative Director of Radiology) will serve as an in-house representative.
 - d. Mr. Roch is readily available by cell phone during both regular and after hours. In the event of an emergency and an onsite visit is required, he is a maximum of 1.5 hrs. away.
4. Mr. Roch will be responsible for overall control and implementation of a safe and effective Radiation Safety Program. He has been given proper authority to do so by our attached "RSO Delegation of Authority" memorandum.

SUBJECT: R.S.O. Delegation Of Authority

You, William Roch, Medical Physicist from Bio-Med Associates, Inc., have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer and are responsible for ensuring the safe use of radiation and radioactive material. As RSO, you are responsible for managing the radiation safety program; identifying radiation safety problems; initiating, recommending, or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities and ensuring compliance with regulations. You are hereby delegated the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of byproduct material by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements and shutting down operations where justified to maintain radiation safety. You are required to notify management if staff does not cooperate and does not address radiation safety issues. In addition, you are free to raise issues with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time. It is estimated that you and/or your designee (physics staff from Bio-Med Associates, Inc.) will spend 1.5 days per month conducting radiation protection activities.
