Mr. Sharawy,

Blake Welling forwarded your email to the current supervisor of my work group, Chris Cahill. Mr. Welling no longer works in this area. My supervisor requested that I respond to your email.

As I told you in my email dated December 3, 2019, we can no longer review the request for a license based on your application from August 13, 2015. That action was voided on June 1, 2016. It has been more than a year since that time, so we cannot re-open a licensing action from that application.

You stated in your email to Mr. Welling that you have a new office in Connecticut. If you wish to apply for a license, you need to submit a new application that provides all the requested information about your new location. You will also have to pay a new license application fee.

 - You will be required to pay a new application fee.
 - Once you have a license, you will also have to pay an annual fee. If you qualify as a small entity, the annual fee could be reduced. You would have to apply for that small entity status each year.
 - If you need to know what the application fee is, you may contact the Fees Resource at fees.resource@nrc.gov or call 301-415-7554. Portable gauges are in Fee Category 3.P. Last year the application fee was \$4,700.00
