Enclosed is Amendment No. 34 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 24-16275-01 for Bothwell Regional Health Center in accordance with your request dated November 24, 2020. Please note that, in the letter you requested the authorization for James R. Bergh, M.D. to work with 10 CFR 31.11 material; however, your license does not list this material. Therefore, we did not list 10 CFR 31.11 material for James R. Bergh, M.D. If you would like to possess and use 10 CFR 31.11 prepackaged kits for in-vitro studies, please provide an amendment request.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) Section 51.22(c).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
