Re: Update to indirect change of control of Connecticut Imaging Partners, LLC (“**CIP**”) NRC
Materials License No. 06-28502-01 (Mail Control No. 623861; Docket No. 030-31642)


Dear Ms. Elliott:

We are in receipt of your correspondence and Safety Evaluation Report, dated March 25, 2021, pursuant to which the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (“**NRC**”) consented to the proposed indirect transfer of control of NRC Materials License No. 06-28502-01. As previewed in a telephone conversation between you and our counsel, Russell Sass of DLA Piper LLP (US), we write to notify NRC of an update in the transferee for such indirect transfer of control. Specifically, Jefferson Radiology, P.C. (“**Jeff Rad**”) holds a 49% minority interest in CIP, and its owner, Curtis Pickert, M.D., intends to sell all of his equity interests in Jeff Rad to Anthony Gabriel, M.D. only; Nina Kottler, M.D. will no longer receive any Jeff Rad equity interests or otherwise be a party to this indirect transfer of control. Following the sale, CIP will remain 51% owned by Hartford Hospital and 49% by Jeff Rad. Jeff Rad, in turn, will be wholly owned by Dr. Gabriel. All other information concerning the proposed indirect transfer of control remains unchanged. Further, Radiology Partners and CIP affirm all of their commitments, as outlined in your Safety Evaluation Report.

Please confirm NRC’s continued consent to this indirect transfer of control, and that the update described herein does not alter such consent.
