Scope and Observations: This was an announced, routine inspection of a hospital authorized by its NRC license to use unsealed byproduct material for diagnostic and therapeutic procedures under 10 CFR 35.100, 200, 300, and 1000 (Y-90). The nuclear medicine department was staffed with one full-time nuclear medicine technologists (NMTs) who performed approximately one diagnostic nuclear medicine procedures daily from Mondays to Fridays. The licensee dose not perform any therapies or Y-90 administrations since the last inspection, those treatment are perform in a near by hospital of Saint Louis University. The licensee dispose of the material utilizing DOE program to remove excess, unwanted, abandoned, or orphan radioactive sealed sources. The manufacturer of the blood irradiator Mikron was present to aid in the removal efforts. The licensee communicated their plans to decommission the unit with the NRC, including updates when the schedule changed. | | | | | | | | | |

| The inspector toured of the nuclear medicine hot lab and discussed with the NMT package receipt, surveys, and instrument quality control checks. The NMT and RSO demonstrated adequate knowledge of radiation safety principle and practices though interviews. The inspector reviewed quarterly audit reports, wipes, surveys, instrument quality control, inventory, dose calibrator linearity and accuracy, and training. The inspector also reviewed monthly dosimetry reports which indicated annual whole-body and extremity doses were below regulatory limits. | | | | | | | | | |
