Dear Dr. Chavali:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 4 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 21-32644-01 in accordance with your May 11, 2021 letter. As requested, we have removed the 200 S Wenona St. location of use and mailing address listed previously on the license. Your request is available electronically from the Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) at Accession No. ML21134A174.

Please review the enclosed document carefully, and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC Region III office at 630-829-9892 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Section 51.22(c).

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys for the 200 S Wenona St., Bay City, Michigan location of use. Based on its review, the NRC staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from the facility and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions, no further remediation or actions are required with respect to NRC-regulated material at the 200 S Wenona St. location of use. Your facilities at 200 S Wenona St., Bay City, Michigan, are suitable for unrestricted use.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; or imposition of a civil penalty; or an Order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance that NRC expects of its licensees.
