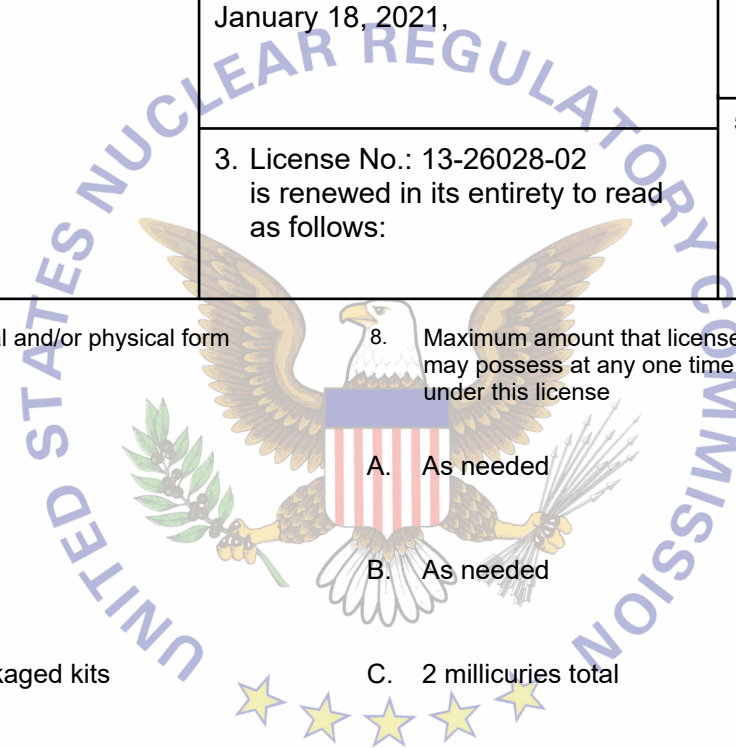


MATERIALS LICENSE
