NRC to Hold Webinar Seeking Comment on Environmental Review Topics for Oconee Subsequent License Renewal

Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will hear the public's views on environmental issues the agency should consider in reviewing Duke Energy's application for an additional 20 years of operation for Oconee Nuclear Station Units 1, 2 and 3.

The staff will hold a webinar on Wednesday, Aug. 25, from 2-4 p.m. Eastern time, to discuss the environmental review process and take comments. NRC staff will consider written comments on environmental topics until Sept. 9, following the publication of a [notice](#) in the Federal Register. Duke Energy submitted the subsequent license renewal application June 7 for the Oconee units in Seneca, South Carolina, approximately 30 miles west of Greenville. The [subsequent license renewal process](#) for Oconee will determine whether its operating reactor licenses can be extended for an additional 20 years beyond the current renewed 60-year licenses (Oconee's initial license renewal added 20 years to its original 40-year licenses). The [application](#), with the proprietary details removed, is available on the NRC website. In addition, a copy of the application and related environmental report is available for public inspection at the Seneca Branch of the Oconee County Public Library, 300 E. South 2nd Street in Seneca.
