2. As described in references 1a-b, the U.S Army Aviation and Missile Command (AMCOM) Safety Office requests the approval of Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) license 01-00126-22 amendment (reference 1c) to accommodate future acquisition and utilization of Modernized Target Acquisition Designation Sight (M-TADS) systems in the Army fleet.

3. The NRC license 01-00126-22 authorizes the possession and use of static eliminators in the Target Designator Rangers for the M-TADS and Pilot Night Vision System. An increase of the Army's AH-64 Apache fleet results in an increase in the M-TADS inventory and associated byproduct material. Reference 1d summarizes the license amendment elements.

This refers to your request for renewal of your NRC license. Enclosed with this letter is the license. An environmental assessment for this action was not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14).

Please be advised that your license expires at the end of the day in the month and year stated in the license. Until your license has been terminated, you must conduct your program in accordance with the conditions of your license, representations made in your license application, and NRC regulations. In particular, note that you must:

1. Operate in accordance with NRC regulations 10 CFR Part 19, "Notices, Instructions and Reports to Workers: Inspections and Investigations," 10 CFR Part 20, "Standards for Protection Against Radiation," and other appropriate regulations.
2. Notify NRC in writing 30 days in advanced of any change in mailing address.
3. In accordance with 10 CFR 30.36(d), notify NRC promptly, in writing, within 60 days and request termination of the license:
 - a. When you decide to terminate all activities involving materials authorized under the license whether at the entire site or any separate building or outdoor area;
 - b. If you decide not to acquire or possess and use authorized material; or
 - c. When no principal activities under the license have been conducted for a period of 24 months.

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4. Request and obtain a license amendment before you:
 - a. Change Radiation Safety Officers;
 - b. Order byproduct material in excess of the amount, or radionuclide, or form different than authorized on the license;
 - c. Add or change the areas of use or address or addresses of use identified in the license application or on the license (except for areas of use where byproduct material is used only in accordance with either 10 CFR 35.100 or 35.200;) or
 - d. Change the name or ownership of your organization.
5. Submit a complete renewal application or termination request at least 30 days before the expiration date of your license. You will receive a reminder notice approximately 60 days before the expiration date. Possession of byproduct material after your license expires is a violation of NRC regulations.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a Notice of Violation, or Imposition of a Civil Penalty, or an Order Suspending, Modifying or Revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy.
