Mr. Anton, Ms. Kang, and Mr. Williams:

In order to provide you with a periodic update to the current status of your Petition, which requested that the NRC revoke Materials License No. 29-31396-01 of Tetra Tech EC, Inc., I'd like to let you know that the status has not changed since the Letter of Abeyance that Michael Case provided to you on December 18, 2019 (attached) (ADAMS Accession No. **ML19309F257**). Specifically that is:

Consistent with the Memorandum of Understanding between the NRC and Department Of Justice (DOJ) to facilitate the exchange of information between agencies (<https://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/mou DOJ.pdf>), the NRC will defer its decision regarding your 2.206 Petition pending the outcome of the DOJ's ongoing civil complaint against TTEC. As a result, the NRC will hold your 2.206 petition in abeyance until the legal resolution of the DOJ civil complaint. At that time, the NRC staff will reassess your petition consistent with the 10 CFR 2.206 process as outlined in Management Directive 8.11.
