Enclosed is Amendment No. 13 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 13-26261-01 per your letter dated September 9, 2021.

This amendment serves to amend your license to reflect the following changes:

- updated license mailing address;
- remove license authorization for the Ohmart Corporation Model SR-1A fixed gauging device following transfer/disposal of this fixed gauging device; and
- updated physical address where licensed materials may be used and/or stored.

In accordance with Title 10 Code of Federal Regulations (10 CFR) §30.36(a), and as indicated in agency correspondence dated September 14, 2021, your license remains valid pending completion of the review of your application for license renewal. An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR §51.22(c).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; or imposition of a civil penalty; or an Order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance that NRC expects of its licensees.
