SUBJECT: AMENDMENT OF RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS LICENSE FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH NETWORK, INC., NRC LICENSE NO. 13-06009-01 AND TERMINATION OF RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS LICENSE FOR COMMUNITY HEART AND VASCULAR HOSPITAL, NRC LICENSE NO. 13-24834-01

Dear Ms. Bell:

In the letter dated October 22, 2021, you provided the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) of a request to transfer the licensed material and the locations of use located at 1400 N. Ritter Avenue, Indianapolis, Indiana, 8075 N. Shadeland, Indianapolis, Indiana, and 1402 E. County Line Road, Indianapolis, Indiana from NRC License No. 13-24834-01 for Community Heart and Vascular Hospital to NRC License No. 13-06009-01 for Community Health Network, Inc. and terminate NRC License No. 13-24834-01. Additionally, you requested to add six authorized users to NRC License No. 13-06009-01.

You submitted information sufficient to permit the transfer of licensed material and facilities located at the addresses above from NRC License No. 13-24834-01 to NRC License No. 13-06009-01. Based on its review, the NRC staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material at the locations above has been transferred from NRC License No. 13-24834-01 to NRC License No. 13-06009-01. Enclosed is Amendment No. 104 to your NRC License No. 13-06009-01 in accordance with your October 22, 2021 request.

Based on the conclusion above, no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC-regulated material are required on the part of Community Heart and Vascular Hospital. The NRC understands that all records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facilities at 1400 N. Ritter Avenue, Indianapolis, Indiana, 8075 N. Shadeland, Indianapolis, Indiana, and 1402 E. County Line Road, Indianapolis, Indiana have been transferred to and will be maintained by Community Health Network, Inc., NRC License No. 13-06009-01. Accordingly, NRC License No. 13-24834-01 is hereby terminated. A copy of the amended license, Amendment No. 32, is enclosed.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) Section 51.22(c).
