16. Scope and Observations:						
This multi-speciality doctor's owned out-patient cardiac clinic is authorized to use materials permitted by Section 35.200. The licensee operated three locations of use. The clinics located in Bloomfield Hills and Clarkston were open Monday-Friday. The licensee's newest clinic in Commerce Township opened in November 2021 and conducted patient studies on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. Each clinic site was staffed with a full-time technologist. This inspection included a review of the licensee's clinics located in Bloomfield Hills and Commerce Township, Michigan. Collectively, the licensee administered approximately 200-250 diagnostic studies per month. The licensee received unit doses from a local radiopharmacy. The licensee retained the services of a consulting physicist who audited the radiation safety program of each clinic location on a quarterly basis; the recent audits performed during the fourth quarter of 2021 identified no findings or violations. During this inspection, the inspector interviewed licensee personnel; observed three patient exercise stress test procedures; observed package receipts and surveys; performed independent, confirmatory surveys; and reviewed select records. The inspector reviewed a selected sample of patient scripts, and records of package receipt surveys and wipe tests, dose calibrator QA/QC, quarterly audit reports by the consultant, training, leak tests, waste disposal, and personnel dosimetry. No violations of NRC requirements were identified during this inspection.
