The CRCPD provides the following response for each of the fifteen comments related to compatibility on SSR Parts A, D, and J received in a letter dated February 28, 2022. There were no comments related to compatibility on SSR Part O.

#1 – As discussed in a meeting between Michelle Beardsley, Stephen Poy, and Michael Snee on March 3, 2022, the CRCPD believes that the definition of “Occupational Dose” found in Section A.2 needs to remain as currently written. States regulate other sources of radiation beyond radioactive material, such as radiation generating equipment, that must be factored into the occupational dose received. We ask that the definition found in “Occupational Dose” found in Section A.2 be found compatible.
