LICENSEE:

The inspection was an examination of the activities conducted under your license as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) rules and regulations and the conditions of your license. The inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector. The inspection findings are as follows:


10 CFR 71.5(a) requires, in part, that each licensee who transports licensed material outside the site of usage, as specified in the NRC license, or where transport is on public highways, or who delivers licensed material to a carrier for transport, shall comply with the applicable requirements of the Department of Transportation regulations in 49 CFR Parts 107, 171 through 180, and 390 through 397.

49 CFR 177.817(a) requires, in part, that a person may not transport a hazardous material by highway unless that person has a shipping paper prepared in accordance with 49 CFR Part 172.

Contrary to the above, on eight occasions between September 21 - November 5, 2021, the licensee failed to have shipping papers prepared in accordance with 49 CFR Part 172 when transporting Class 7 (radioactive) hazardous material by highway. This is a Severity Level IV violation (Section 6.3.d).

Statement of Corrective Actions

I hereby state that, within 30 days, the actions described by me to the Inspector will be taken to correct the violations identified. This statement of corrective actions is made in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.201 (corrective steps already taken, corrective steps which will be taken, date when full compliance will be achieved). I understand that no further written response to NRC will be required, unless specifically requested.
