Dear Commissioners:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Office of Legacy Management is submitting the enclosed annual management plan for the Grand Junction, Colorado, Disposal Site.

There are no plans to receive residual radioactive material at the Grand Junction disposal site in 2022. The site will be open to accommodate DOE's requirements and to place co-polymer soil stabilization on the open portion of the cell as per requirements. Activities at the site, such as annual maintenance and regulatory monitoring, will also occur. The current volume available for disposal as of 2022 is estimated at 219,611 yd³.
