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PART I.D -- COMMENTS

Upon receipt of your request, we sought clarification from you with respect to item 5 of your request. You confirmed that you are asking for the final memorandum that the Office of General Counsel (OGC) issued in response to Melanie Galloway's memorandum. We tasked the OGC, the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR), and the Office of Nuclear Regulatory Research (RES) to locate any records responsive to your request.

This first interim response addresses the records located to date by NRR and OGC. NRR staff identified the following records responsive to item 1 of your request, which the NRC has already made publicly available in ADAMS:
