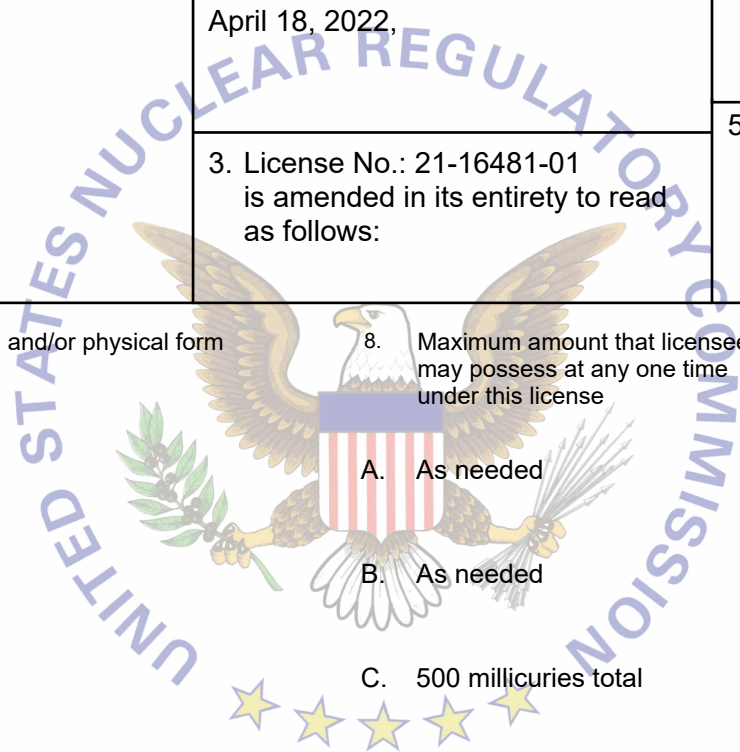


MATERIALS LICENSE

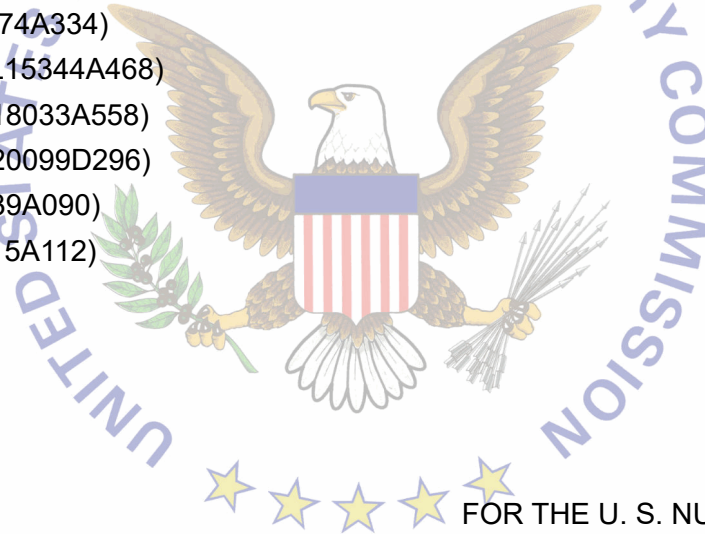
