Hi. I am writing from the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, to update you on New York City adoption of regulations compatible with NRC. The attached regulation (Article 175 of the New York City Health Code) has been in effect in New York City effective May 24, 2019. Note the regulations for radioactive materials begin on page 102 of the attached document.

Specifically, I want to state that our New York City regulations (attached) are compatible with NRC regulations as updated in the following Review Summary Sheets (by RATS ID):

2015-2, 2015-3, 2015-4, 2015-5, 2018-1, 2018-2, 2018-3, 2019-1, 2019-2, 2020-2, 2020-3, 2021-1, 2021-2. (RATS ID 2020-1 has no regulations that are relevant for our program.)

Because our code uses a cite-by-reference format to adopt NRC regulations by reference, the regulation is still compatible with NRC updates that have been made both before and since its adoption.
