Enclosed is Amendment No. 110 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Material License No. 21-04177-01 in accordance with your requests dated July 12, 2022, and September 19, 2022.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) Section 51.22(c).

In your letter dated July 12, 2022, you provided the history of use and final status survey results for a facility located at 61 North St. Joseph Avenue, Niles, Michigan 49120. You also confirmed that all residual licensed material used at this location had been removed – such that any remaining residual radioactivity is within the limits of 10 CFR Part 20, Subpart E.

Based on its review of the information provided, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from the location of use and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities at this location of use does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required. Your facility at 61 North St. Joseph Avenue, Niles, Michigan 49120, is suitable for unrestricted use.

You will be periodically inspected by the NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action(s) against you. This could include issuance of a Notice of Violation, or Imposition of a Civil Penalty, or an Order Suspending, Modifying or Revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy.
