Thanks for sending the requested documents following the onsite NRC inspection of the irradiator removal activities. I appreciate your thorough follow-up regarding the radiation surveys in the storage area immediately outside of the irradiator room. I also want to acknowledge the work that you and many others at QMC put into planning the irradiator removal as well as developing and implementing a thorough security plan for the irradiator removal activities.

As discussed with you yesterday, the NRC inspection of The Queen's Medical Center was a limited scope review for the licensed activities related to the irradiator decommissioning and removal. As a result, this inspection does not re-set the next routine inspection due date for the license. The attached NRC Form 591M Inspection Report indicates that no violations were identified.
