General Comment

It appears additional consideration to keeping Palisades in operation have been introduced. Governor Whitmer and Secretary Granholm have made public statements in support of "doing everything they can" to keep Palisades in operation. The owner, Holtec is requesting a second level of consideration for federal funding to keep the plant in operation.
