This refers to your request to amend your license dated December 21, 2022. In order to continue our review of your request, the following additional information is needed:

Section 8.7.3 Radiation Safety Officer of NUREG 1556 Volume 11 Rev 1, Consolidated Guidance About Materials Licenses: Program-Specific Guidance About Licenses of Broad Scope, <https://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/nuregs/staff/sr1556/v11/index.html> provides licensees with guidance on information to provide to support the authorization of Radiation Safety Officers for licenses of broad scope. While Mr. Root has been approved as an Associate Radiation Safety Officer under 10 CFR Part 35, this designation does not cover all the authorized uses on the license, e.g. research and development as defined in 10 CFR 30.4, instrument calibration, student instruction, and in-vitro studies. Please provide the following information:

1. Describe the individual's on-the-job or formal training, including the location and duration of the training for the proposed RSO that demonstrates the individual is qualified to perform the duties required under the license. Training should cover (a) principles and practices of radiation protection, (b) radioactivity measurements, standardization, and monitoring techniques and instruments (c) mathematics and calculations basic to the use and measurement of radioactivity, and (d) biological effects of radiation.
2. Address the RSO's experience in performing each of the duties listed in the "Duties and Responsibilities" section of 8.7.3, when and where the experience was gained, and the type, form, and quantity of radionuclides involved.

Your reply must be an originally signed and dated letter. The letter may be scanned and submitted as a pdf document attached to an email addressed to me. If we do not receive a reply from you within 30 calendar days from the date of this e-mail, we will assume that you do not wish to pursue your amendment request.

Please respond by e-mail to acknowledge that you have received the e-mail request for additional information.
