17. Scope and Observations: This was an unappounded routine inspection of a non-destructive testing company authorized to use radioactive								
This was an unannounced routine inspection of a non-destructive testing company authorized to use radioactive material for industrial radiography at a fabrication shop in Springfield, Missouri, and at temporary job sites in NRC jurisdiction. At the time of the inspection, the licensee employed two radiographers (including the RSO) and one radiographer's assistant who worked full-time at the Springfield facility, conducting weld inspections of stainless steel vessels manufactured on-site within a designated area as well as at temporary job sites in Missouri. The licensee was in the process of transitioning to exclusively x-ray radiography technology, had not received a new source since August 2022, and had not performed radiography under its NRC license since October 2022.								
During the inspection, the inspector toured the licensee's facility, including the material storage area, the designated radiography area, and the licensee's radiography truck to evaluate the licensee's measures for material security, access control, postings, and exposure control. During the tour, the inspector verified the licensee equipment and instrumentation appeared to be operational and in good material condition. There were no scheduled exposures to observe, but the inspector interviewed the RSO and other radiographer regarding the licensee's procedures for material receipt, inventory control, boundary control during radiographic operations, routine inspection and maintenance of equipment, source exchange and disposal, and emergency response procedures. The inspector also reviewed a selection of records associated with inventory, instrumentation calibration, dosimetry records, radiographer field audits, equipment inspections, leak test results, shipping papers, and periodic program reviews.								
No violations of NRC requirements were identified as a result of this inspection.
