

# The IMPEP Basics


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# Section 274 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended

- provides the statutory basis by which the NRC may discontinue portions of its regulatory authority to license and regulate byproduct materials, source materials, and certain quantities of special nuclear material.
- requires that the NRC, in its oversight role, to periodically review Agreement States to ensure the radiation control programs are adequate to protect public health and safety and compatible with the NRC's regulatory program





### Periodic Review

To ensure public health and safety are adequately maintained and Agreement State programs are compatible with NRC's regulatory program.

- Technical Staffing and Training,
- Status of Materials Inspection Program
- Technical Quality of Inspections
- Technical Quality of Licensing Actions
- Technical Quality of Incident and Allegation Activities

#### NON-COMMON

- Legislation, Regulations, and other Program Elements (LROPE) [formerly known as "Compatibility"],
- Sealed Source and Device Evaluation Program
- Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Program
- Uranium Recovery Program

- Satisfactory
- Satisfactory but Needs Improvement
- Unsatisfactory



## Recommendations

Constructive feedback to promote improvement

This can serve as the basis for developing recommendations for corrective actions.

The team should seek to identify and understand the root cause(s) of the programmatic performance issues.

### BEFORE THE ON-SITE REVIEW

- Questionnaire
- Inspector accompaniments

#### ON-SITE REVIEW WEEK

- Entrance meeting on Monday
- Review casework
- Interviews
- Documentation
- Staff briefing on Thursday
- Senior management exit on Friday

#### AFTER THE ON-SITE REVIEW

- Results documented in a publicly-available report
- Management Review Board (MRB) Meeting


Document your findings following the IMPEP report template
