Enclosed is Amendment No. 20 to Labcorp Early Development Laboratories Inc.'s (your) U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 21-32816-01 in accordance with your April 10, 2023 request, to remove your commitment to retain your radioactive waste for a minimum of ten half-lives, as stated in your December 24, 2020 renewal application. Your letter and application are available electronically, respectively, from the Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) at Accession Nos. ML23114A050 and ML20364A141. The NRC's ADAMS is accessible from the NRC Web site at <https://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Section 51.22(c).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; or imposition of a civil penalty; or an Order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance that NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's expectations for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
