Dear Mr. Vink:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 07 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 21-23325-02 in accordance with the request dated August 25, 2023, signed by Wayne A. Harrall, Deputy Managing Director - Engineering, and your request dated September 15, 2023.

This license amendment serves to remove your facility located at 1500 Scribner Ave., NW, Grand Rapids, Michigan, as a permanent storage site.

Your requests identified that all licensable radioactive material have been accounted for and appropriately transferred to your permanent storage site in Walker, Michigan. Documentation of the transfer of licensed radioactive materials, including associated leak test reports were reviewed.

Based on this review, it appears that all licensed devices have been removed from your facility and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current U.S. NRC criteria. Your facility is suitable for release to unrestricted use.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that appropriate corrections and answers may be provided.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) Section 51.22(c).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; or imposition of a civil penalty; or an Order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance that NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
