SUBJECT: AMENDMENT NO. 51 TO RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS LICENSE FOR SAINT LOUIS UNIVERSITY, U.S. NRC MATERIALS LICENSE NO. 24-00196-07

Dear Mr. Haenchen:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 51 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 24-00196-07 in accordance with your requests dated September 15, 2023, and October 20, 2023.

This amendment reflects the following changes to your license:

- authorization to possess and use the ABK Biomedical Eye90 Microspheres in accordance with the existing license authorization provided in Items 6, 7, 8 and 9, Subpart B and the commitments identified in Condition 23, Parts L and M;
- modifies Item 8, Subpart A, and adds Condition 13 to your license, relieving you from preparing and submitting a decommissioning funding plan in accordance with Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) 30.35(d) provided that you restrict your possession of unsealed byproduct material to quantities less than or equal to 10^5 times the applicable limits in Appendix B of 10 CFR Part 30;
- updates Condition 17 to expand the prohibition from usage of experimental animal, or animal products, to include uses for both human or animal consumption; and
- removes Condition 21 that had limited acquisition of sealed sources and devices to those registered in accordance with 10 CFR §32.210.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that appropriate corrections and answers may be provided.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR Section 51.22(c).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This

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could include issuance of a notice of violation; or imposition of a civil penalty; or an Order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance that NRC expects of its licensees.
