Enclosed is Amendment No. 68 to W.A. Foote Memorial Hospital d/b/a Henry Ford Health Jackson Hospital's (your) U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 21-00258-06, in accordance with your letter dated November 10, 2023, requesting to remove two Authorized Users (AUs). Your letter is available electronically from NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) at accession number ML23318A271. The NRC's ADAMS is accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>.

Please review the enclosed document carefully, and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC Region III office, so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Please note, in accordance with the removal of Dr. Heisel as an AU, the remaining AUs authorized for Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Section 35.300 medical use, in Condition No. 12.B., have uses limited to the oral administration of sodium iodide I-131. Accordingly, we have updated your license Subitem No. 6.C. to limit authorized 10 CFR 35.300 materials to the oral administration of sodium iodide I-131. To expand authorized use of 10 CFR 35.300 materials in the future, you may submit an amendment request, including a physician qualified for additional uses of 10 CFR 35.300 materials. No action is needed at this time.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; or imposition of a civil penalty; or an Order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance that NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's expectations for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
