Enclosed is Amendment No. 1 to your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 13-35681-01 in accordance with the requests dated October 12, 2023, October 27, 2023, November 15, 2023, and December 5, 2023, all signed by Travis Behnke, Director of Operations, to amend your U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Materials License No. 13-35681-01.

Congratulations on your appointment as Radiation Safety Officer. Additional information, guidance and resources are available from the agency to assist you. This includes NUREG-1556, Volume 2, Rev. 1, February 2016, "Consolidated Guidance About Materials Licenses: Program-Specific Guidance About Industrial Radiography Licenses," particularly including Appendix F, "Six-Month Radiographer/Radiographer's Assistant Inspection Checklist," and Appendix G, "Radiation Safety Program Audit." In addition to identifying your appointment as Radiation Safety Officer, your license has also been amended to reflect the following changes:

- removal of authorization to perform source retrieval;
- addition of depleted uranium for use of shielding in radiography equipment;
- increase in the license authorization for the number of authorized radiography cameras; and
- removal of former Condition 15, Part B, regarding leak testing and inventory requirements for sealed sources authorized for uses other than radiography, which is not applicable.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that appropriate corrections and answers may be provided.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Section 51.22(c).

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You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you.
