To the **NRC Freedom of Information Act Officer**:

Under the [Freedom of Information Act](#) 5 U.S.C. § 552, I am requesting an opportunity to inspect or obtain the following records for the purposes of news gathering regarding climate hazards to US nuclear power plants, and their preparedness for climate-related events:

- Any documents, correspondence, and/or reports produced between January 2011 and January 2017 related to the post-Fukushima work on flooding in which climate change is discussed, especially those related to the Japan Lessons Learned initiative.

If there are any fees for searching or copying these records, please inform me if the cost will exceed \$25. However, I would also like to request a waiver of all fees in that the disclosure of the requested information is in the public interest and will contribute significantly to the public's understanding of US nuclear power facility's preparedness for climate change. I will use this information in my reporting. This information is not being sought for commercial purposes.

If possible, please supply any records electronically. To the extent, possible please send records as they become available as well.

If you intend to deny this request, I will expect to hear from you within the 20 business days after confirming the receipt of my request as mandated by law. Also, if you expect a significant delay in responding to this request, please contact me with information about when I might expect copies or the ability to inspect the requested records.

I am additionally requesting expedited processing due to the urgent need to inform the public regarding the potential risks involved in the NRC's work regarding relicensing nuclear plants, and pressing concerns about the exposure of US infrastructure to climate-related hazards. This is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.
