1. What are the known technical or regulatory issues with the current version of the Regulatory Guide (RG)?

There are no known technical or regulatory issues with the current version of the RG. This regulatory guide was initially issued in April 2009 to establish guidelines for complying with requirements regarding power reactor licensee procedures for responding to notifications of potential aircraft threats in Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) 50.54(hh)(1), which became effective on December 23, 2011.

Revision 1 of RG 1.214 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML14002A098) was issued in March 2014. This revision incorporated editorial changes and updated references to related guidance for emergency preparedness (EP). These changes were intended to improve clarity of the guidance and alignment with the EP requirements in 10 CFR Part 50, Appendix E, and did not alter the staff regulatory guidance.

2. What is the impact on internal and external stakeholders of not updating the RG for the known issues, in terms of anticipated numbers of licensing and inspection activities over the next several years?

As there are no known issues with the current version of the RG, there is no impact to internal and external stakeholders in maintaining the current revision. Licensing and inspection activities over the next several years are not anticipated to be adversely impacted in maintaining the current revision of the RG.

3. What is an estimate of the level of effort needed to address identified issues in terms of full-time equivalent (FTE) and contractor resources?

Because there were no issues identified, there are no resources needed.

4. Based on the answers to the questions above, what is the staff action for this guide (Reviewed with no issues identified, Reviewed with issues identified for future consideration, Revise, or Withdraw)?
