**Could you please reply back to confirm receipt?**

This is in response to Charlotte Hungerford Hospital's amendment request letter dated February 26, 2024, requesting to add Joseph Santoro, M.D. as an authorized user for 10 CFR 35.100, 35.200, and 35.300. You indicated that Dr. Santoro is authorized for these uses under New York State license number 585. In order to continue our review, please provide the following additional information:

1. Please provide a copy of the whole license so that recentness of training and licensed materials can be verified.

If the license is greater than seven years old, please submit documentation of recentness of training as required by 10 CFR 35.59.

Please note that Dr. Santoro is not authorized for all of 10 CFR 35.300. His authorization is limited to the oral administration of sodium iodide in I-131 in any quantity. Please confirm if this authorization is acceptable. If you are requesting that Dr. Santoro be authorized for all of 10 CFR 35.300, please provide documentation showing that Dr. Santoro meets the requirements of 10 CFR 35.390, including clinical casework. The attached NRC Form 313A (AUT) may be helpful to use.
