Dear RSO Elliott:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 23 to your NRC Materials License No. 37-23370-01 in accordance with your April 27, 2023 and May 18, 2023 requests. This amendment removes the 9560 E Remus Rd. location, adds two locations, and adds requested source models, all of which are as specified on the enclosed license. Your applications are available electronically from the Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) at Accession Nos. ML23116A126 & 23142A229, respectively.

In letter dated April 27, 2023, you contacted the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission and indicated that you have decommissioned the field station located at 9560 E Remus Rd, Mt. Pleasant, Michigan. The NRC staff has reviewed all submitted information. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from your facility and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions, no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required. Your facility at 9560 E Remus Rd., Mount Pleasant, MI, 48858, is suitable for unrestricted use.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required because this action is categorically excluded under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) 51.22(c).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary
