Technical Specifications Task Force (TSTF) Quarterly Meeting

On May 8, 2024, staff and the industry-led Technical Specifications Task Force (TSTF) conducted a regularly scheduled quarterly meeting, as noted in Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. <u>ML24113A152</u>. The TSTF presented data on the history of traveler adoptions (<u>ML24129A066</u>) and a proposed change to the Pressurized Water Reactor Emergency Core Cooling System Mode 4 Requirements (<u>ML24129A067</u>). The next TSTF quarterly meeting will take place in August.

<u>Public Meeting with NOV Shepherd Power, BWX Technologies, and the Nuclear Energy Institute to Discuss Shepherd Power's Licensing and Business Models for the Use of Micro-reactors</u>

On May 14, 2024, staff held a public meeting with NOV Shepherd Power, BWX Technologies, and the Nuclear Energy Institute to discuss Shepherd Power's licensing and business models for the use of micro-reactors for the oil and gas industry and other industrial applications. Staff provided an overview of areas being evaluated for "Nth-of-a-Kind" micro-reactor licensing. Stakeholders shared positive feedback with staff for its transformational and creative thinking in this area and discussed vendor and industry perspectives regarding "Nth-of-a-Kind" micro-reactor licensing topics for continued future consideration.

Public Meeting on the Reactor Oversight Process (ROP)

On May 15, 2024, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff hosted a public meeting related to the Reactor Oversight Process (ROP) to discuss: The status of a revision to reporting guidance for degraded and unanalyzed conditions in NUREG-1022, the NRC staff response to FAQ 23-03 Revision 1 (a Turkey Point Unplanned Scrams Performance Indicator (ML24115A264)), an NRC staff analysis of resources charged to baseline inspection preparation and documentation (ML24122C453), a proposed revision to Inspection Procedure 93100, "Safety Culture/Safety-Conscious Work Environment Issue of Concern Follow-up" (ML24122C632 and ML24115A194), and potential future Focused Engineering Inspection topics. Industry representatives provided additional discussion related to the concept of centralized inspections. Attendees included representatives from NEI, NextEra Energy, and members of the public. The next bi-monthly public meeting on ROP-related matters is tentatively scheduled for July 17, 2024.

Staff Issued Two Amendments for River Bend Station, Unit 1 to Adopt Technical Specifications Task Force Traveler TSTF-505 and to Implement 10 CFR 50.69

On May 16, 2024, staff issued two amendments for River Bend Station, Unit 1 (River Bend) to (1) adopt TSTF Traveler TSTF-505 for risk-informed completion times (CTs) of limiting conditions for operation (LCOs) in Technical Specifications (TS) and (2) implement 10 CFR 50.69 for risk-informed categorization and treatment of structures, systems, and components. The TSTF-505 amendment adds substantial flexibility by providing for up to a 30-day backstop for TS LCO CTs. The 10 CFR 50.69 amendment allows the implementation of a process for

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categorizing and special treatment of structures, systems, and components using risk. The development of the licensee's Probabilistic Risk Assessment to support these initiatives will provide substantial opportunities to enhance the use of risk in licensee programs and operations. Including these River Bend approvals, staff has issued 33 TSTF-505 amendments and 36 10 CFR 50.69 amendments for nuclear power plants.

Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installation Security Requirements: Discontinuation of Rulemaking Activity; Denial of Petition for Rulemaking; 10 CFR Part 72 and 73 [NRC-2009-0558, NRC-2008-0649; PRM 72-6; RIN 3150-AI78]

On May 14, 2024, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) published a notice in the *Federal Register* (89 FR 41901) discontinuing the rulemaking activity, "Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installation Security Requirements for Radiological Sabotage," and denying Request 11 in the associated petition for rulemaking (PRM), PRM-72-6. The purpose of this action is to inform members of the public that this rulemaking activity is being discontinued and to provide a brief discussion of the NRC's decision to discontinue the rulemaking and deny the petition. The rulemaking activity will no longer be reported in the NRC's portion of the Unified Agenda of Regulatory and Deregulatory Actions (the Unified Agenda). As of May 14, 2024, the rulemaking activity discussed in this document is discontinued and Request 11 in the petition for rulemaking is denied.
