## U.S. NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION SALARIES AND EXPENSES APPROPRIATION FISCAL YEAR 2024 PROPOSED REPROGRAMMING

As shown in the table above, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) intends to reprogram \$10.713 million of prior year funds from the Nuclear Reactor Safety control point to the Corporate Support control point. This reprogramming supports the Three White Flint North (3WFN) relocation project and the new primary continuity of operations (COOP) site, which are high priority needs in FY 2024.

The U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) has notified the NRC that it must vacate spaces currently leased in 3WFN by September 3, 2027. GSA requires full construction funding prior to procurement of the construction firm, which is anticipated to begin in the third quarter of FY 2025. This proposed reprogramming would aid the agency in satisfying this requirement and with mitigating potential schedule delays outside of its control (e.g., limited funding availability under a potential continuing resolution in FY 2026, supply chain risks, construction delays), while avoiding a costly holdover fee of approximately \$21.2 million for failure to exit 3WFN in a timely manner in the first year. Specifically, the resources for the 3WFN relocation project would fund (1) the basic renovation costs associated with constructing a new Headquarters Operations Center (HOC), Special Use Areas (SUAs), and Consolidated Data Center (CDC) within the One White Flint North building; and (2) information technology (IT) infrastructure equipment, and related cybersecurity infrastructure costs for the new CDC.

Further, the NRC is proceeding with the establishment of a new primary COOP site, which is expected to be fully operational in FY 2026. The COOP site will serve as the new disaster recovery site and is currently the only viable contingency option for the HOC and SUAs. This proposed reprogramming would support back up IT related infrastructure and systems for the COOP site.
