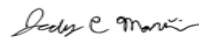

The Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) Met with Holtec Decommissioning International (HDI) to Discuss Their Plans to Close Out Generic Letter (GL) 2004-02 for Palisades Nuclear Plant

On October 24, 2024, the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) held a public meeting with Holtec Decommissioning International, LLC (HDI), to discuss their plans to close-out Generic Letter (GL) 2004-02 “Potential Impact of Debris Blockage on Emergency Recirculation During Design Basis Accidents at Pressurized-Water Reactors” for Palisades Nuclear Plant. HDI stated that they evaluated the different closure options, and a risk informed approach was selected, though additional testing and calculations are being done to see if the alternate break methodology can be used. HDI plans to send in a closure plan letter in the 4th quarter of 2024 and the final response and close-out letter to GL 2004-02 in 2nd quarter of 2026. The meeting was attended by about 60 people, including three news outlets.
