I just called and tried to leave a message but it got cut off so not sure if you will receive it or not.

I think Option 1 would be best at this point. The P.R. BOP said 30-60 days, which could mean we have the license number in the next week or two or not until the end of February. In the interest of closing out the current amendment and RSO request, I think option 1 would work and we can submit a new amendment request once we have the license number and reference the control number as you mentioned below.

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Thank you, Cami, I am in receipt.

Regarding Manuel – I believe my hands are tied until he receives the PR pharmacy license. As a result I can do one of two things:

- Option 1: I can issue a partial amendment naming Marco as the RSO on the license, but withholding Manuel as an ANP. Under this option you can refer to the current mail control (644222) whenever the PR Board of Pharmacy issues the pharmacy license and we'll open a new amendment and know that other relevant information was provided under this mail control number.

- Option 2 is I can hold the amendment open until the PR Board of Pharmacy issues the pharmacy license. If this is a matter of days I'd be happy to sit and simply be patient. If the Board of Pharmacy is not the most *speedy* organization and you anticipate months, I would prefer and encourage you to consider Option 1. I have never been on the receiving end and do not know what kind of timeline to expect but hope you and your team has some familiarity. As we have certain timeliness metrics we are responsible for within my organization, if the amendment drags on too long without the final puzzle-piece of information, I will issue a letter 'suspending' the technical review of the action – this has no material effects on you or your license, it is simply a mechanism to stop our internal clock on a licensing action.

Please let me know how you'd like to proceed. If you have any questions or concerns about the above, please do not hesitate to reach out – I'd be happy to have a call or exchange emails as you prefer. I will be on inspection next week from Tuesday through at least part of Friday, and Monday is a federal holiday, so unless you call this week an email will probably be a better means of getting hold of me!

I look forward to hearing back from you.
