Subject: POLICY OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS REGARDING HAZARD REPORTS AND HAZARDS EVALUATION BRANCH STAFF ANALYSES

Dear Mr. McCone:

Commencing with its May 1959 meeting the practice of the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards shall be to place on the agenda items upon which advice is requested, such as site evaluations, reactor reviews or other pertinent topics, only if information has been furnished the Committee on the following bases:

- a) Hazards reports at least 30 days in advance of the meeting; and
- b) Hazards Evaluation Branch staff analyses at least 15 days in advance of the meeting.

Exceptional cases proposed for inclusion in an agenda which do not meet these requirements must receive consent of a majority of the Committee at least 5 days prior to the meeting.
