Dear Adriana Ayuso,

We have reviewed your revised license renewal application dated May 5, 2025, for a U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) license. Your application is available electronically from the Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) at Accession No. ML24094A226.

Based on the review, our office communicated that additional information was needed from you to complete our review of your revised license renewal application. Specifically, the NRC provided a list of deficiencies that required a response under the signature of a certifying official (as described in NUREG-1556, Volume 9, Revision 3, Section 8.13). On May 29, 2025, the NRC sent a further email to you to inquire as to the status of the response. On June 5, 2025, you provided an updates that suggested the imminent completion of a response to the NRC's requested information. Due to the delay in receiving the additional requested information that is necessary for review of your application, the NRC cannot project when it will make a determination on the application request. Once a complete and appropriately signed response is received, the NRC will provide an updated date for the NRC to complete its review. If an adequate response is not received by September 28, 2025 (12 months less the time spent in the first suspension, which lasted from July 11, 2024, through March 25, 2025), the NRC will administratively close or deny the request, as appropriate.

Please note that if your request is administratively closed, the reviewer will discuss the suspended renewal application with NRC management and determine if the application should be denied as described in Section 4.11.2 of NUREG-1556, Volume 20, Revision 1. A denial would require divestiture of all NRC-licensed radioactive material in the licensee's possession upon expiration of the license (see Section 4.23 of NUREG-1556, Volume 20, Revision 1, for additional information regarding license expiration). If your request is administratively closed, you may submit a new license request at a later date and refer to Control No. 642065 for the documentation you have already submitted.
