Materials Inspection Report (Continued)

10 CFR 35.40(a) states, in part, that a written directive must be dated and signed by an authorized user before the administration of any therapeutic dosage of unsealed byproduct material.

Contrary to the above, on October 31, 2023, the licensee failed to have a written directive dated and signed by an authorized user before the administration of a therapeutic dosage of unsealed byproduct material. Specifically, the licensee administered a therapeutic dosage of yttrium-90 and the person that dated and signed the written directive was not an authorized user.

The licensee identified the violation during a program review. The licensee identified the administration occurred during the individuals course of training to obtain authorization. NRC License No. 11-27346-01, Amendment No. 47, dated February 14, 2025, granted the individual authorization for yttrium-90 administrations. Additional corrective action was to provide training reinforcing that only an authorized user named on the NRC licensee shall date and sign a written directive. This violation was non-repetitive and non-willful.
